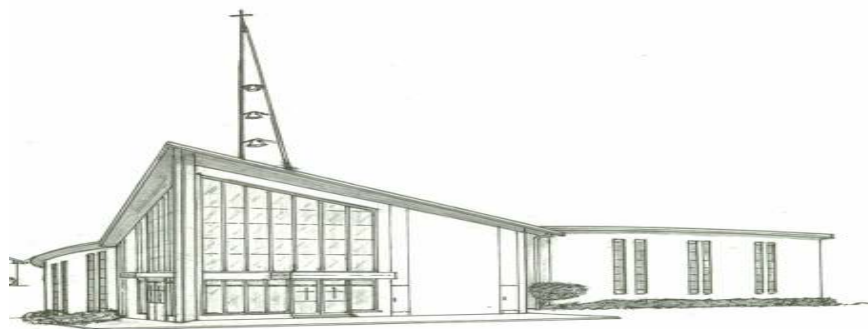

**FAST AND ABSTINENCE
AND OTHER ACTS OF PENANCE FOR LENT
2017**

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, March 1, 2017, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in Parish Lenten Devotions as well as Lenten Education Programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

All are encouraged to participate in Operation Rice Bowl which has aided countless hungry persons here in the Archdiocese as well as throughout our nation and our world.

We also encourage you to remember the Parish DORCAS Fund, which helps our fellow parishioners in Financial difficulty. The DORCAS Boxes can be found at every entrance in Church. The DORCAS Fund continues throughout the year.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA was established by St. John Paul II in 1985 to provide the Catholic Church's full range of pastoral ministries to those in the US Armed Forces.

The mission of the Archdiocese is to "serve those who serve" by providing the pastoral care and services to Catholics serving in the US Armed Forces, enrolled in the US Military Academies, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veterans Affairs' Medical Centers in the US; Puerto Rico and Guam, working in civilian jobs for the Federal Government beyond US borders, and the families of these populations. The Archdiocese and its endorsed priests and deacons are responsible for pastoral service to approximately 1.8 million Catholics. However, unlike a convention diocese, the Archdiocese has no parishes or parish registries and no weekly collections. It relies solely on the generosity of private donations to support its programs and services.

Last year, Pope Francis told military ordinaries from around the world that "the role of Military Chaplains is to accompany and support [those in need] on the journey, to be a comforting and brotherly presence for them all." (Pope Francis Address to participants in the 8th Humanitarian Course, 26.X.15.) Your support of the Archdiocese for the Military Services will bring the Gospel, the sacraments and other forms of spiritual support to men and women who serve our Country and defend our freedoms, including parishioners and families from our own diocese.

This collection will be conducted next weekend (**March 4/5**). I ask your continued prayers and generous financial support of this collection.

EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The price is wrong

Prosperity theology, sometimes called the prosperity gospel, is the notion that believers who confess their faith and are generous with tithes and offerings will in turn be rewarded generously by God with material riches. Most popular in Pentecostal traditions, it can be heard on some or another television station every hour of the day and night. Be wary of any teaching that disguises the love of riches behind the veil of such teachings. Jesus warned us that we can only serve one master. Ask yourself which it will be—the love of money or the love of God—around which you will center your life.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Isaiah 49:14-15; 1 Corinthians 4:1-5; Matthew 6:24-34 (82)*. "No one can serve two masters . . . You cannot serve God and wealth."

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 27

The Ten Commandments count

"The Ten Commandments are not multiple choice," a church sign stated. Admittedly we sometimes do pick and choose among them. But most of the time it may be that we just haven't thought through how they apply to our own lived experience. Here's one way to rediscover the Commandments and be more conscious of living them. Create a chart with four columns. In the first, list the Ten Commandments. In the second, write something from Jesus' life and teaching that relates directly or indirectly to that Commandment. In the third, prayerfully write your own paraphrase of the Commandment. In the fourth, list specific ways that you can incorporate the spirit of the Commandment into your daily life.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Sirach 17:20-24; Mark 10:17-27 (347)*. "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 28

Give your body a rest

"Carnival" ends today, and tomorrow our time of attentiveness to spiritual matters begins. Being in the world of the senses, and then stepping back for a time through a bit of denial, is part of the process of deepening our spiritual identity in the world. Flesh and spirit are essential elements in Christian

discipleship, as are justice and mercy and intimacy and awe. Knowing how to appropriately weave these elements in our daily lives is the role of wisdom. Use Lent as a time to give your full attention to prayer, spiritual reading, and devotional practices. Ultimately your body and soul will be the stronger and wiser for it.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Sirach 35:1-12; Mark 10:28-31 (348)*. "But many that are first will be last, and the last will be first."

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 1

ASH WEDNESDAY; DAY OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Out and about

With the beginning of Lent we might tend to look inward, to focus on prayer and repentance, on resetting our interior compass in a more God-ward direction. But the three traditional practices of Lent—prayer, fasting, almsgiving (which work all year round, by the way)—point us outward as much as inward. We pray for both ourselves and others. We fast to clear our lives of what prevents us from seeing God in others and the world. And we learn to show more generosity to those around us. So this year don't let yourself get Lenten cabin fever. Practice also in the world.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Joel 2:12-18; 2 Corinthians 5:20—6:2; Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18 (219)*. "We are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us."

THURSDAY, MARCH 2

THURSDAY AFTER ASH WEDNESDAY

Make the right choice

Choosing life over death seems like a no-brainer—instinctive, natural, wholesome. Yet our culture, with its emphasis on escaping pain at all costs, can easily lead us to emotional, spiritual, and even physical death: Don't want to face the humiliation of asking for forgiveness? Cut off your relationship with a loved one. Don't want to be hurt by anyone? Close the door on intimacy. Don't want to feel the pain of loss, confusion, or failure? Numb yourself with alcohol or drugs. Our faith offers a different strategy. It's called love. Try loving yourself, others, and God just a little bit more to get you past the pain.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Deuteronomy 30:15-20*;
Luke 9:22-25 ([220](#)). "I have set before you life and death, the blessing and the curse. Choose life, then."

FRIDAY, MARCH 3

MEMORIAL OF KATHARINE DREXEL, VIRGIN

Hold nothing back

What would you sacrifice to keep a good thing going? After 125 years serving Catholics of color, the Blessed Sacrament Sisters, founded by Katharine Drexel, put their motherhouse near Philadelphia up for sale a few years ago in order to dedicate more funds to ministry. Drexel, the "Millionaire Nun," would have approved. She herself gave away a fortune to educate struggling communities few Americans cared about. A white woman of

privilege, Drexel used pencils to the nub and wrote on the backs of envelopes to save precious resources for land, schools, and teachers. Fast today and support the liberation of the disenfranchised with an education.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Isaiah 58:1-9a*; *Matthew 9:14-15* ([221](#)). "Would that today you might fast so as to make your voice heard on high!"

Family is the treasure behind family income

While for most Americans, working has as its goal the creation of a stable home, it can become a hindrance to people's coming together as a family. Is making money more important than the family life the income is meant to support? With the high cost of living in America today, the majority of families find two incomes are needed simply to stay afloat, but how can we make sure the family stays front and center? We are called by the prophet Isaiah to be rebuilders of our household. That, of course, begins at home. Bring the family together whenever possible.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Isaiah 58:9b-14*;
Luke 5:27-32 ([222](#)). " 'Repairer of the breach,' they shall call you, 'Restorer of ruined homesteads.' "

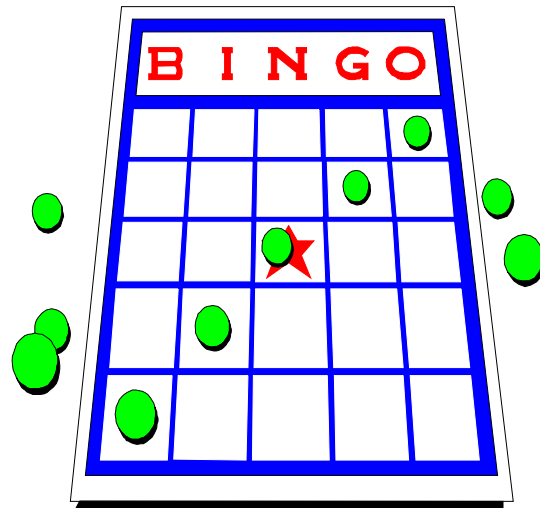
